Country Highlight- Ecuador

<u>Population</u>= ~17.08 million

President= Lenin Moreno

State Religion = Roman Catholic (79%)

While Ecuador's main religion is Roman Catholicism, their constitution protects religious freedom. Evangelicals stand at about 11%, Atheism/Agnosticism 7%, Jehovah Witnesses 1% and, other beliefs/practices at 2% of the population. Currently there are about 250 Nazarene churches with about 22,100 members.

Even though the Nazarene Church has been in Ecuador since 1972, and other evangelical churches before, there are still many villages unreached in the heart of the Amazon jungle. Just last year a group of 4 leaders from the Iberra Church of the Nazarene traveled into the Shuar communities located in the Ecuadorian jungle to show the Jesus Film and do activities for the children. These leaders traveled to many different villages where they were warmly accepted because many were hungry for God, heard Christ for the first time, and accepted Him! If you are ever up for a great movie about how God

has and is working in Ecuador, watch **The End of the Spear** based on a true story of missionaries who sacrificed their lives to share the Gospel.

Reflecting With Our Brothers & Sisters In Christ

Holiness Today once shared an article titled *Persecution: Our Family In Pain*. When we think of many of our brothers and sisters in Christ being persecuted, what comes to mind? Even though we "know" many are killed or imprisoned, do we truly in our hearts believe it could be so bad or even try to empathize and ask the Lord to break us for what they are going through? Or do we say "Yeah, we know," and just brush it off?

The reason for the questions is because this article is about how many people within the church today meet their pastors or special speakers with skepticism when they hear about the the persecuted church. The writer of the article gives two reasons as to why the church seems to be in almost a state of unbelief about Christian persecution. The first being that before all the advances in communication, our persecuted brothers and sisters were not talked about, and it was assumed that all churches around the world experienced most of the same religious freedoms as we do. Yet secondly, even though we have the advancements now in knowledge of the ways Christians are being persecuted, some choose to not believe it whole heartedly because it is just too painful and daunting to hear about in order to seriously intercede on behalf of those being persecuted. For to truly intercede, one has allow the Lord to break them for what breaks His heart.

"But persecution is real - not just to some nameless Christians out there, but to our Nazarene family." Let us humble ourselves in that we may ask the Lord to break our hearts for our brothers and sisters in Christ who are suffering for His name sake. Here is just one of many examples of persecution just within the Nazarene church given in the article {*Names and country not mentioned for protection}:

From Prison to Preaching

"Nothing dampens plans for an exciting district assembly like news that 25 of the delegates-including a pastor and his son-have been kidnapped by radical religious terrorists. They were beaten, stripped, and all but one of their mobile phones seized. That phone was taken after a distress call was made.

The pastor, his son, and two other leaders landed in jail, accused of forcing people to convert to Christ from other religions. For days, nothing more was known about these people or the other 21 villagers accompanying them.

Incessant prayers flew to God's throne, pleading for delivery of these people, for preservation of their lives, and for their fortified faith.

The district assembly proceeded, but the time was changed as a safety precaution. Records were set for the shortest sermon preached and the quickest reports received. The assembly concluded in less than two hours, and people evacuated the premises before the time the meeting had originally been scheduled to begin.

Heart-wrenching hours stretched into days. Nazarene leaders monitored the situation and planned possible interventions.

Finally, the four prisoners were released. We learned that the other 21 delegates - without money, food, or shelter - had somehow gotten back to their homes, hundreds of kilometers away.

When asked how his teenager had endured the persecution, the pastor responded quietly, 'While we were being abused in prison, my son realized that God called him to preach. He wants to lay down his life for Christ and the Cross. He wants to share the love of Jesus with people in darkness and disbelief, such as those who captured and mistreated us. His faith has advanced more than I could have imagined."
